Exotically perfumed, single-vineyard wine, partly barrel-fermented. Alsace style, mouthfilling and complex, with intensely varietal stonefruit, ginger and spice flavours, finely textured, soft and rich.

GOURMET TRAVELLER WINE

Bob Campbell, April 2011

90 Points

Made from hand-picked grapes grown on the clay soils of Seresin's hillside Raupo vineyard. Barrel fermentation of a small percentage of this wine has introduced some extra savoury complexity to an already concentrated gewürztraminer. An off-dry style that's beautifully balanced and shows classic rose and spice flavours with a hint of toasted brioche. It's a very complete wine that will be appreciated by those who want more than a fruit bomb.

MARLBOROUGH EXPRESS

Deborah Walton & Peter Morice, February 2011

This one has 14 per cent alcohol. A gentle aroma with notes of rose Turkish delight, vanilla, lemon sherbet, loquat and lychee. The palate initially delivers some crisp flavour teamed with a sherbet-like acid tingle opening up mid-palate with vanilla, mandarin, and rose-scented Turkish delight flavours. An intensely flavoured wine that's rich, warming and delivers some gingery spice and alcoholic heat towards the finish. Quite textural, it leaves a sticky, slightly sweet Turkish delight coating on the tongue yet the overall impression is of a reasonably dry style. Very enjoyable lightly chilled.
